Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- define and provide examples of the basic features of the syntax of Standard Chinese
- account for the structure and historical development of the Chinese writing system
- account for basic methods and concepts that are relevant to the learning of
- account for the most common syntactic errors made by Swedish students of Chinese

Competence and skills

- make themselves understood in basic spoken Standard Chinese
- use basic and more advanced grammatical constructions in a text without aids
- make basic reflections on didactic processes in a situation of teaching Chinese
- at a basic level identify and correct the most common syntactic errors made by Swedish students of Chinese

Judgement and approach

- reflect on their development in Standard Chinese and identify their need of further knowledge
- reflect on cultural differences and similarities manifested in the source and target languages
- reflect on their development in the field of subject didactics of Standard Chinese and identify their need of further knowledge

Course content

The course deals with the basic features of Chinese syntax from a contrastive perspective through text study and different types of exercises. Students practise written proficiency mainly through recurring exercises focusing on the relevant grammar. Oral proficiency is practised partly through conversation on current textbook texts and partly through discussions of everyday topics. Throughout the course, the students practise reading comprehension through reading of a long text adapted to the present level. The module on subject didactics introduces different didactic working methods and enables the student to take part of different upper secondary school teachers' experiences of and problems in teaching Chinese. Subsequently, students select an issue to be addressed in a minor paper based on literature in subject didactics.

The course consists of the following modules:

Module 1: Text Study 1, 7.5 credits

Module 2: Conversation 1, 5 credits

Module 3: Text Study 2, 7.5 credits

Module 4: Conversation 2, 5 credits

Module 5: Subject Specific Didactics for Mandarin Chinese 1, 5 credits

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures and group exercises in modules 1-4. In module 5, the teaching consists of lectures, group exercises and seminars requiring compulsory attendance at the group exercises (2-3) and seminars (2-3).

Assessment

The assessment of module 1 is based on a written invigilated exam.

The assessment of module 2 is based on an oral test.

The assessment of module 3 is based on a written invigilated exam.

The assessment of module 4 is based on an oral test.

The assessment of module 5 is based on a take-home exam and 1-2 written assignments.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

For a grade of Pass on the whole course, the student must have been awarded at least this grade on all modules. For a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must also have been awarded this grade on modules 1, 3, 4 and 5.

Entry requirements

General and courses corresponding to the following Swedish Upper Secondary School Programs: Chinese 3, English 6, Social Studies 1b/1a1+1a2.
