Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2009-10-15 to be valid from 2009-10-15, spring semester 2010.

General Information

The course is a compulsory component of the Master of Arts programme in Language and Linguistics specialising in Arabic. The course is also offered as a free-standing course and can normally be included as part of a first- or second- cycle degree. With the approval of the relevant authenticating body, it can also be included in certain professional degrees.

Language of instruction: Arabic and Swedish

The course is normally taught in Swedish and Arabic. It can be taught in English if an agreement is reached by both the teacher and the students.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to read, analyse and interpret a representative selection of modern Arabic poetry and fiction
- demonstrate knowledge of forms of expression of modern Arabic poetry and fiction.

Competence and skills

- aided by supervision, be able to identify interpretative problems in modern Arabic poetry and fiction
- know and be able to use relevant reference literature.

Judgement and approach

• be able to take a position with regard to a general humanist tradition and relate it to the history of Arabic literature and to a chosen area of enquiry.

Course content

The course consists of reading and analysis of a representative selection of modern Arabic poetry and fiction and of independent interpretation of poetry and fiction.

Course design

Teaching consists of lectures, seminars, group exercises and supervised independent studies.

Assessment

Examination takes the form of a written and, when applicable, oral examination in conjunction with the course.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course students must have a Bachelor's degree in Arabic or the equivalent.
