Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the pro-dean for first-cycle studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2011-09-28 and was last revised on 2016-05-30. The revised syllabus applies from 2016-08-29, autumn semester 2016.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It is included in the Master's (120 credits) programme in Theology and Religious Studies. It can be included in a degree of Master (120 credits) within the main field of Religious Studies and Theology.

Religious Studies and Theology

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- account for theories of socialisation and communication
- interpret and apply models of teaching religion connected to the problem area of religious and cultural mediation of tradition

Competence and skills

- analyse and provide critical, constructive and relevant views on theories of socialisation and communication
- analyse and provide constructive and relevant views on models of teaching religion

Judgement and approach

- independently and critically assess and perceive the significance of theories of socialisation and communication for an understanding of religious and cultural mediation of tradition
- independently and critically assess the importance of models of teaching religion for an understanding of religious and cultural mediation of tradition

Course content

The course discusses and provides perspectives on the mediation of religious and cultural traditions in schools, religious communities and mass media using different models of teaching religion and theories of socialisation, collective memory and communication.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures and seminars.

Assessment

The assessment is based on three written assignments to be discussed at the seminars, and a final written take-home exam.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have 90 credits of higher education.
