ENGA41, English: English Literature, 7.5 credits Engelska: Engelsk litteratur, 7,5 högskolepoäng First Cycle / Grundnivå

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2019-06-18 and was last revised on 2023-03-24. The revised syllabus applies from 2023-03-24, autumn semester 2023.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It is also included in the Bachelor's programme in English. It can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- account for basic literary terminology
- identify and account for key themes in contemporary English language fiction

Competence and skills

- read and analyse contemporary English fictional texts
- discuss English language fiction texts in speech and writing and with appropriate vocabulary
- apply literary concepts in discussions about, and analyses of, contemporary English language texts
- with access to relevant aids, write simple scholarly texts in English which are clearly structured, correctly paragraphed and display the correct use of English

Judgement and approach

- at a basic level, identify and discuss explicit and implicit statements about class, gender and ethnicity in texts
- critically reflect, in both speech and writing, on their own arguments and analyses as well as those of others.

Course content

The course enables the student to improve their ability to assimilate English texts as well as their ability to analyse and discuss fiction using theoretical frameworks. In addition, the students critically reflect on key theories and concepts, in speech and in writing. Literature in different genres and from different parts of the English-speaking world is studied and analysed with regard to both language and content and students practice writing brief literary analyses.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures and seminars.

Assessment

The course is assessed through two papers as well as through participation in 2-11 seminars during the course. The number of seminars required for a Pass is dependent on the student's achievements in other assessed components (see information on grading below).

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

The grade for this course is based on the credits for the different components listed under 'Assessment' above (100 points in total). For a grade of Pass, the student is to have at least 66 points, and for a Pass with Distinction, the student is to have at least 85 points.

Entry requirements

General requirements and studies equivalent of course English 6 from Swedish Upper Secondary School.
