ENGE12, English Literature, 7.5 credits Engelsk litteratur, 7,5 högskolepoäng First Cycle / Grundnivå

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2019-02-01 and was last revised on 2023-03-24. The revised syllabus applies from 2023-03-24, autumn semester 2023.

General Information

This is a freestanding course intended for exchange students only.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- account for basic literary terminology
- identify and account for key themes in contemporary English language fiction

Competence and skills

- discuss in spoken and written English and with appropriate vocabulary relatively advanced English fictional texts
- with access to relevant aids, write simple scholarly texts in English which are clearly structured, correctly paragraphed and display the correct use of English
- read, discuss and analyse modern English texts of a general nature

Judgement and approach

• identify and discuss the implicit and explicit statements about class, gender and ethnicity in texts at a basic level

Course content

The course provides the students with practice in reading and understanding English texts, and the ability to express themselves orally and in writing in correct, polished English. Literature from different parts of the Anglophone world is studied and analysed with regard to both language and content. The students practise writing short texts of a general nature. Furthermore, they practise planning their time and relating to set timeframes.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures and seminars.

Assessment

The assessment is based on two papers as well as activities at 2-11 seminars throughout the course. The number of seminars required for a Pass is dependent on the student's performance on other assessed components.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

The grade for this course is based on the credits for the different components listed under 'Assessment' above (100 points in total). For a grade of Pass, the student is to have at least 66 points, and for a Pass with Distinction, the student is to have at least 85 points.

Entry requirements

General requirements and studies equivalent of course English 6 from Swedish Upper Secondary School.
