ENGH04, English: Level 2 (46-60), 15 credits Engelska: Fortsättningskurs (46-60), 15 högskolepoäng First Cycle / Grundnivå

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the prodean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2015-09-11 to be valid from 2015-09-11, spring semester 2016.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Language of instruction: English

Main field of studies

English

Depth of study relative to the degree requirements G1F, First cycle, has less than 60 credits in first-cycle course/s as entry requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- account for the history of English literature including the most vital characteristics of the various periods and their most important authors and works
- provide a specialised account in speech and writing of a specific area of English linguistics or literature
- account for some important parameters for learning words and phrases in a foreign language efficiently

Competence and skills

- use an extensive general and basic academic vocabulary of words and phrases in English receptively and productively in correctly produced speech and writing
- analyse fictional and non-fictional texts in English in terms of content and be able to discuss and argue for different interpretations
- discuss advanced English fiction and non-fiction in spoken and written English using appropriate terminology

Judgement and approach

• discuss explicit and implicit statements about class, gender and ethnicity in texts

Course content

In a literary overview course the students study a selection of English texts from the earliest times to the late 20th century with an emphasis on the most famous authors. These are studied in the context of cultural history. The student will also take a specialised elective course in either English literature or linguistics. The learning of new vocabulary is seen as an ongoing process, carried out, primarily, as self-study. Students are also to pursue practising their ability to plan and keep up with predetermined timeframes.

The course consists of the following modules:

- 1. British Literary History, 7 credits,
- 2. Elective Course, 5 credits,
- 3. Vocabulary, 3 credits.

The elective course is to be chosen from a selection of courses in either linguistics or literature. The list of elective courses is approved each semester and is available through the course website or distributed by the director of studies or equivalent.

Course design

The teaching consists of group exercises, lectures and seminars. Compulsory assessed seminars may be included in module 2 Elective Course.

Assessment

The assessment is based on:

Module 1 British Literary History: Written exam

Module 2 Elective Course: Depending on the character of the relevant course, for example written exam, written assignments such as a take-home exam, analytical paper, response paper, or learning journal, oral presentations and compulsory assessed seminars. The assessment can also be based on the performance of a play.

Module 3 Vocabulary: Written exam.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

To be awarded a grade of Pass on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on all modules. To be awarded a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must also have been awarded this grade on at least 10 credits.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have passed ENGH03, English: Level 2a (31-45), or the equivalent.

Further information

- 1. The modules are identical to three of the modules in English: Level 2, 31-60 credits. This is a part-time (50%) course that is taught throughout the semester and together with the students on the course English: Level 2, 31-60 credits.
- 2. The credits allocated for course content that in whole or in part is commensurate with another course can only be credited once for a degree. For further details see the current registration information and other relevant documentation.
- 3. The course is offered at: Centre for Language and Literature/English, Lund University.
