Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2017-11-13 to be valid from 2017-11-13, spring semester 2018.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can be used as a Level 4 course in Ethnology. it can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Main field of studies

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- account for career opportunities and types of employment for an ethnologist
- account for the relevance of expertise in ethnology in a future professional role, and how perspectives and methods of ethnology can be applied in different types of activities
- account for the conditions, challenges and opportunities of a project in ethnology

- account for concepts and methods with regard to the planning, implementation and reporting of a project
- critically reflect on the internship experience in relation to the subject of ethnology and the knowledge acquired through their education in ethnology

Competence and skills

- independently plan, execute and report a knowledge-based project in ethnology within a predetermined timeframe
- use knowledge and skills in ethnology in the performance of a professionally relevant internship
- write a clear and problematising report

Judgement and approach

- identify and assess the need and legitimacy of knowledge in ethnology
- judge and assess the conditions of project work as an assignment or method, including its properties, prerequisites and potential problems
- independently identify and formulate future career opportunities and their potential need of continuing professional development

Course content

The course makes up one semester and consists of two modules:

- 1. Project (15 credits)
- 2. Qualified Internship (15 credits)

The aim of the course is to increase the student's possibilities to use professionally the expertise in ethnology they have acquired during three semesters of study.

In module 1, the students are to plan, execute and report an individual project. The project could be based on the knowledge the student has acquired from the Bachelor's degree project in ethnology. Furthermore, the module includes a series of study visits to possible workplaces in order to establish contact with activities and organisations where training and expertise in ethnology are relevant. Examples of organisations are public authorities, institutions, companies or associations.

In module 2, the students are to test their expertise in ethnology through a qualified internship at a relevant host organisation.

Course design

Module 1: The teaching consists of 5-10 study visits followed by group seminars, and supervised independent project work. The study visits and group seminars are compulsory.

Module 2: The module consists of a qualified internship. It is the responsibility of the student to find a suitable work placement, which is subsequently to be approved by the course director following an agreement on the content and terms of the internship. The teaching consists of supervision. On completion of the internship, the

Assessment

The assessment of module 1 is based on participation in the group seminars, completion of the project according to plan and a final written project report.

The assessment of module 2 is based on the completion of an internship in accordance with the agreement and the final written internship report.

The examiner may deviate from the regular form of examination if it cannot be implemented during a re-examination, and if it complies with the learning outcomes of the course.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have 90 credits in ethnology including Ethnology Level 3.
