Course goal

A passing grade on the course will be awarded to students who: Knowledge and understanding

• Have knowledge of and can account for central theories within the field of organization theory.

Skills and abilities

• Have the ability to identify problems and choose relevant actions with the help of models and concepts discussed during the course.

Judgement and approach

• During a seminar can account for and discuss a particular decision-making process with the help of models and concepts discussed during the

course.

• Can show an ability to conduct self-tuition.

Course content

The overall goal of the course is to provide students with breadth and depth in organization theory and to train the students in advanced problem solving. Put differently, central concepts within organization theory such as power, control, networks, strategy, leadership, change and learning are discussed and problematized.

Course implementation

The course is designed as a series of lectures and seminars. Grading is based on an individual written exam and participation in the seminars. Five re-exams are provided.

Course examination

Grading scale

At the School of Economics and Management grades are awarded in accordance with a criterion-based grading scale A-U (A-F). Students have to receive a grade of E or higher in order to pass a course.
