Details of approval

General Information

Subject: Film Studies

The course is offered as a freestanding course.

Language of instruction: English

Subject to an agreement between the lecturers and all students, all or parts of the teaching can take place in Swedish. Such an agreement would depend on everyone concerned being proficient in Swedish.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- account for manifestations of national and European culture or how specific historical events are described in film or on television
- provide a general account of theories that address the phenomena covered in the course, such as theories of adaptation or cultural memory

Competence and skills

- analyse examples of how specific cultural phenomena or historical phenomena are described in film and television from Scandinavia and Europe
- reflect on how film and television relate to general cultural or historical conceptions in the present as well as in the past

Judgement and approach

 assess the artistic, the history of ideas and social importance in Scandinavia and Europe of the cultural and historical representations that are discussed in the course.

Course content

The course presents the image of Scandinavia and Europe and its culture and history in television series and films. The examples range from German historical drama and British literary adaptations to current representatives of Scandinavian television drama. Furthermore, the course presents and uses theories that highlight the phenomena discussed in the course.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures, group work, seminars, film screenings and film discussions.

Assessment

The assessment is based on a minor paper that is also to be presented at a seminar.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.
