FRAK11, French: B. A. Course, 30 credits Franska: Kandidatkurs, 30 högskolepoäng First Cycle / Grundnivå

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the pro-dean for first-cycle studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2016-02-25 and was last revised on 2016-03-31. The revised syllabus applies from 2016-03-31, spring semester 2016.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Language of instruction: French

Main field of studies

French

Depth of study relative to the degree requirements G2E, First cycle, has at least 60 credits in first-cycle course/s as entry requirements, contains degree project for BA/BSc

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- account for basic concepts in rhetoric, focusing especially on academic contexts
- account for, discuss and apply basic research methodology and concepts for the study and analysis of language and literature
- provide an advanced account of some important Francophone literary works and situate them in a context of literary and cultural history
- account for some current research issues within French literature or French linguistics

Competence and skills

- understand spoken French in varying speech situations, particularly in academic contexts
- assimilate complex, extensive and varied texts in French
- use rich spoken and written French adapted to the situation and meeting high requirements of precision and correctness
- produce texts and oral presentations in French meeting high requirements of clarity and logical structure
- analyse French language and literature with awareness of methodology and established terminology
- seek, collect and assess information and present assessments of the reliability of the information
- independently formulate, execute and report in writing a research assignment in French within a predetermined time frame in one of the specialisations language or literature
- apply and discuss research methodology within their area of specialisation

Judgement and approach

- critically review their own and a fellow student's research assignment
- assess the importance of methodological aspects within their area of specialisation, either language or literature
- understand and take a position on the ethics inherent in a scholarly approach

Course content

The course places major emphasis on oral and written proficiency and on text study and comprehension. These components integrate knowledge and skills that prepare for the research project. Compared to the previous course, the present one provides considerable more scope for research methodology and a scholarly approach. The course includes a degree project that is to be discussed at a seminar.

The course consists of the following modules:

- 1. Academic Writing and Methodology, 7 credits,
- 2. Academic Rhetoric, 4 credits,
- 3. French Literature, 4 credits,
- 4. Degree Project, 15 credits.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures, seminars and group exercises. Attendance amounting to at least 80% of the lectures and exercises is compulsory.

Assessment

The assessment is based on:

Module 1: Academic Writing and Methodology: 2-5 compulsory written assignments Module 2: Academic Rhetoric: Oral exam Module 3: French Literature: 1-2 compulsory written assignments, 1-2 oral exams

Module 4: Degree Project: A research paper assessed by the supervisor after discussion and defence of it at a public seminar. The grading will also take into account the student's oral defence of the paper and critical review of a fellow student's degree project.

Passed degree projects at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology can be registered in the LUP Student Papers database if the student so wishes. The student is responsible for uploading the passed degree project as a PDF file in LUP student papers.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

To be awarded a grade of Pass for the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade for all modules. To be awarded a grade of Pass with Distinction for the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade for 19 of the course's credits, of which 15 credits must be from the degree project.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, the students must have passed French: Level 2 (FRAA02 or FRA12), or the equivalent.

- 1. The course replaces FRAK01.
- 2. Modules 1, 2 and 3 are shared with French: Level 3 (FRAA03).
- 3. The credits allocated for course content that in whole or in part is commensurate with another course can only be credited once for a degree. For further details see the current registration information and other relevant documentation.
