### KRMC12, Church and Mission Studies: Level 3 A, 15 credits

Kyrko- och missionsstudier: Fördjupningskurs, 15 högskolepoäng First Cycle / Grundnivå

### Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the pro-dean for first-cycle studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2014-11-11 and was last revised on 2017-02-21. The revised syllabus applies from 2017-08-28, autumn semester 2017.

#### General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can be selected as a specialisation course in the Bachelor's programme in Religious Studies and Theology. The course can be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Language of instruction: Swedish

The language of instruction is mainly Swedish, but some components may be taught in other Scandinavian languages or English.

# Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

### Knowledge and understanding

- account for the role of early Christian traditions for the shape and development of Christian traditions today, with special focus on a chosen theme
- focusing on a chosen theme, account for how early Christian traditions are interrogated, revised and recycled in relation to various challenges in modern society
- account for basic elements of different theoretical models describing changes in tradition
- account for basic elements in the critical treatment of source material

#### Competence and skills

- independently find, assess and critically interpret information of relevance to the chosen theme and for a method discussion focused on source criticism
- independently identify and formulate how Christian tradition is adapted and revised in accordance with new times and contexts
- independently apply methods of source criticism to different sources
- independently relate their analyses based on source criticism to discussions about the use and usefulness of source criticism
- independently apply different theoretical models that describe changes in tradition to a source material

#### Judgement and approach

- judge and understand changes and objections to tradition in a broad scholarly, societal and religious context
- assess and take a position on current debates about the emergence of Christianity and the role of early Christian tradition in the present

#### Course content

The course mainly consists of independent text study. In the first part of the course, students will be able to specialise in one of three possible themes that examine the mutability of the Christian tradition and highlight the heritage of early Christianity in present-day Christian traditions:

- a) Church and power
- b) Body, gender and sexuality
- c) Liturgy and rite

The second part of the course consists of independent study of one or several sources that are discussed and examined from the perspective of the method texts of the course.

The course consists of the following modules:

- 1. Tradition and Change- The Early Church and the Challenges of the Present, 10 credits
- 2. Method Study- Source Criticism, 5 credits

### Course design

The course consists of independent study as well as teaching in the form of lectures, compulsory seminars with oral presentations or supervision. In connection with five of the seminars, the student is expected to submit a written assignment. Students have to make up for absence from compulsory seminars through written assignments in accordance with instructions from the lecturer.

#### Assessment

The assessment of module 1 is based on a written assignment including an oral presentation.

The assessment of module 2 is based on a take-home exam.

#### Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

The grades awarded are Fail, Pass or Pass with Distinction. For a grade of Pass on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on both modules. For a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on both modules.

### **Entry requirements**

To be admitted to the course, the student must have passed the following courses: Church and Mission Studies: Level 2 (KRM B11) **or** Church and Mission Studies: History of the Churches (KRM B23/KRM D23) and Church and Mission Studies: Church Traditions (KRM B24/KRM D24) or the equivalent.
