Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2017-03-22 to be valid from 2017-03-22, autumn semester 2017.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a first or second-cycle degree.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- account for the linguistic diversity in Sweden that derives from present-day immigration patterns
- account for the grammar and sound system of different immigrant languages in comparison with Swedish
- account for grammatical and phonological differences between different immigrant languages

Competence and skills

- recognise the impact of a specific first language on the speaker's secondlanguage usage of Swedish (=target language)
- perform a field study (collect and analyse data) of immigrant languages in Sweden
- provide a scholarly description of recent immigrant languages in Sweden

Judgement and approach

• take a critical and nuanced position on different ideas about the impact of immigrant languages on the Swedish language environment

Course content

The course provides an overview of the current linguistic diversity in Sweden composed of present-day immigrant languages. The aim of the course is to raise awareness about the other languages heard in Swedish society. Among the topics in focus are the grammatical and phonological characteristics of these languages in comparison with Swedish, and the course aims to create understanding of how these properties may influence on the speaker's learning of Swedish. Furthermore, the course provides students with skills to execute a field study in a multilingual environment and carry out a comparative analysis between first language and target language. Languages associated with different language families will be addressed: Albanian, Arabic, Dari, Russian, Bosnian, Somali, Thai etc.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures, a compulsory group assignment and a compulsory seminar.

Assessment

The assessment is based on an individual written report of the field study, which is also to be presented orally in groups.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.
