Learning outcomes

The aim of the course is to enable students to acquire the following knowledge and skills on completion of the course.

Knowledge and understanding

The student shall on completion of the course

- have a basic knowledge of vocal polyphony (Palestrina counterpoint),
- have a broadened knowledge of the history, development and different aesthetic directions of counterpoint and also

• have a broadened knowledge of methods within polyphonic music creating.

Course content

The course can include assignments in instrumental polyphony/Bach counterpoint (two and three part writing) as well as elementary studies/assignments in four part writing. The course also includes assignments in vocal polyphony/Palestrina counterpoint (elementary counterpoint (the five species) as well as two and three part writing) and elementary studies/assignments in four part writing. The course assumes approved result of earlier course MUSI56.

Course design

The course is carried out in the form of group lessons and individual work (exercises, preparations).

Assessment

Examination of the course is arranged through continuous assessment and tests/exams. Examination rules, such as examination requirements and mark limits, shall be communicated to the student at the beginning of the course.

Re-examination of the course shall be offered in close connection to the regular examination.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

The course grade relates to the fulfillment of the learning outcomes of the course.

Fail means insufficient fulfillment of the course learning outcomes.

Pass means sufficient fulfillment of the course learning outcomes.

Pass with distinction means good and in-depth fulfillment of the course learning outcomes.

The course grading is done through the qualitative weighing of the fulfillment of the individual course learning outcomes.
