Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by Education Committee of the Performane and Church Music Department on 2017-11-29 to be valid from 2017-11-29, autumn semester 2017.

General Information

Compulsory course in Master's Programme in Church Music: Arranging/Composition, second cycle 120 credits.

Language of instruction: Swedish and English

Learning outcomes

To independently and on a high level be able to act in musical life, the student shall on completion of the course have acquired the knowledge, skills and values formulated below.

Knowledge and understanding

The student shall on completion of the course

- show very good craftsmanship
- have developed broadened knowledge within the main field of study,

- show advanced knowledge and understanding of part of the course's field of study and also
- have knowledge of artistic processes in general and own working methods in particular.

Competence and skills

The student shall on completion of the course

- show the ability to reflect on the personal artistic approach, and that of others, in a wider artistic context and also
- be able to independently solve artistic problems and problems regarding interpretation.

Judgement and approach

The student shall on completion of the course

• show the ability to make assessments considering relevant artistic aspects.

Course content

The course content consists of individual proficiency training in harmony and ear training. The course assumes approved result of earlier course MUSR34.

Course design

The course can be carried out in the form of individual lessons, group lessons, seminars and individual work (practicing, preparations).

Assessment

Examination of the course is arranged through continuous assessment and tests. Examination rules, such as examination requirements and mark limits, shall be communicated to the student at the beginning of the course.

Re-examination of the course shall be offered in close connection to the regular examination.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass.

Entry requirements

In addition to general entry requirements for higher education at second cycle level the following specific entry requirements are applied:

Degree of Bachelor in Music 180 credits or the equivalent as well as passed selection based entrance examination for Master's Programme in Music.
