Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by Education Committee of the Performane and Church Music Department on 2017-11-29 and was last revised on 2022-10-12. The revised syllabus applies from 2023-01-01, spring semester 2023.

General Information

Compulsory course in Bachelor's Programme: Individual Programme, first cycle 180 credits.

Learning outcomes

The aim of the course is to enable students to acquire the following knowledge and skills on completion of the course.

Knowledge and understanding

The student shall on completion of the course

- show a developed technical skill on the instrument and
- •
- when playing, show a developed understanding of the style and expressions of the current repertoire.

Competence and skills

The student shall on completion of the course

- show the ability to independently study and carry out artistic assignments and also

- show the ability to critically reflect on the personal artistic approach.

Judgement and approach

The student shall on completion of the course

• show the ability to have a constructive dialogue with other artists.

Course content

The content of the course is based on the individual student's needs. Together with the faculty management the student makes an individual study plan in which is placed strong emphasis on the student's needs and vision for musical development and direction. The course assumes approved result of earlier course MUUF82.

Course design

The course consists of individual lessons and individual work (practicing, preparations, projects) as well as group studies.

Assessment

Examination of the course is arranged through continuous assessment and tests/exams. Examination rules, such as examination requirements and mark limits, shall be communicated to the student at the beginning of the course.

Re-examination of the course shall be offered in close connection to the regular examination.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.
