Compulsory course in Bachelor's Programme in Church Music: first cycle 180 credits.

Learning outcomes

The aim of the course is to enable students to acquire the following knowledge and skills on completion of the course.

Knowledge and understanding

The student shall on completion of the course

- have good direction towards a basic knowledge of different musical styles and their performance practices and concert traditions and also
- have good direction towards a basic ability to co-operate with others in joint projects and ensembles.

Competence and skills

The student shall on completion of the course

- show good direction towards the ability to reflect on the personal artistic approach,
- show good direction towards a basic ability to conceive, plan and carry out, and take responsibility for own projects/concerts/events in different contexts and also
- show good direction towards the ability to, at a basic level, orally or in writing, make a personal presentation and a presentation of the music in front of fellow musicians or an audience.

Judgement and approach

The student shall on completion of the course

- show good direction towards a basic ability to identify personal needs for skill development,
- show good direction towards a basic ability to make assessments considering relevant artistic, social and ethical aspects and also
- show good direction towards a basic understanding of the role of art in society.

Course content

The course can contain projects, study visits and more within the field of church music.

Course design

The course is carried out in the form of group lessons, seminars, guest lectures, workshops/master classes, rehearsals, presentations and individual work. Attendance is compulsory for projects within the education.

Assessment

Examination of the course is arranged through continuous assessment and, in applicable cases, project presentations. Examination rules, such as examination requirements and mark limits, shall be communicated to the student at the beginning of the course.

Re-examination of the course shall be offered in close connection to the regular examination.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.
