Learning outcomes

To independently and on a high level be able to act in musical life, the student shall on completion of the course have acquired the knowledge, skills and values formulated below.

Knowledge and understanding

The student shall on completion of the course

• show good direction towards very good instrumentation skills and

• show good direction towards very good knowledge of the aesthetic orientations and values of instrumentation in contemporary western art music.

Competence and skills

The student shall on completion of the course

- show good direction towards the ability to reflect on the personal artistic approach, and that of others, within a wider artistic context, and
- show good direction towards the ability to independently solve artistic problems and problems regarding interpretation.

Judgement and approach

The student shall on completion of the course

• show good direction towards the ability to make assessments considering relevant artistic aspects.

Course content

The course can contain instrumentation analysis, shorter exercises in relevant techniques as well as advanced instrument performance.

Course design

The course is carried out in the form of group lessons and individual work (exercises, preparations).

Assessment

Examination of the course is arranged through continuous assessment and tests/exams. Examination rules, such as examination requirements and mark limits, shall be communicated to the student at the beginning of the course.

Re-examination of the course shall be offered in close connection to the regular examination.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

Entry requirements

In addition to general entry requirements for higher education at second cycle level the following specific entry requirements are applied:

Degree of Bachelor in Music 180 credits or the equivalent as well as passed selection based entrance examination for Master's Programme in Music.
