The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the prodean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2008-05-14. The syllabus comes into effect 2008-05-14 and is valid from the autumn semester 2008.

Subject: Musicology

The course is offered as a single course. It can normally be included as part of a first or second cycle degree. With the approval of the relevant authenticating body, it can also be included in certain professional qualifications.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to demonstrate knowledge of both the practical and theoretical nature of choir music
- be able to give an account of the conditions and function of choir music

Competence and skills

- be able to describe, analyse and interpret choir music, at a basic level
- be able to place choir music in its relevant historical context
- be able to work with issues concerning musicology using a critical and scholarly approach
- be able to vividly communicate the nature of musicology practically, orally and in writing, using appropriate language

Judgement and approach

- be able to relate his/her knowledge of musicology to various social and cultural contexts
- be able to participate actively in musical life with a musicological approach.

Course content

The course contains theoretical and practical exercises concerning essential elements of choir music. In addition, the temporal and tonal aspects of music which contribute to collective performances characterised by discipline, security and flexibility are examined. The course includes analyses where students study both the formal and expressive processes of a work, in order to experience how insights at rehearsals affect practical choir performances.

Course design

Teaching consists of classes, practical exercises, group work, seminars and supervised independent studies. The practical exercises and supervised independent studies may be compulsory.

Assessment

Examination takes the form of a take-home examination, oral examinations and continuous assessment.
