Details of approval

The syllabus is an old version, approved by The Board of the Department of Economics on 2014-01-21 and was valid from 2014-01-21, spring semester 2014.

General Information

This is a single subject master course in economics. The course is obligatory for students specialising in financial economics within the two-year Master Programme in Finance at Lund University.

Tuition is given in Swedish or English.

Learning outcomes

Knowledge and understanding

Students shall demonstrate:

- an understanding of advanced theories and models in the chosen area,
- knowledge of relevant empirical methods to analyse the chosen issue,
- an understanding of the relevant theories and methods to analyse the problem of the essay.

Competence and skills

Students shall have the ability to independently:

- apply advanced theories and models in the chosen area,
- apply relevant empirical methods to analyse the chosen issue,
- draw relevant conclusions from the analysis undertaken,
- adopt a critical and scientific approach,
- account for and discuss the analysis undertaken in writing in a structured and scientific manner,
- adequately summarise the content of the essay and the most important conclusions, in speech and in writing,
- present and discuss the essay at a seminar,
- evaluate and discuss other essays.

Judgement and approach

Students shall develop:

- an ability to identify relevant research issues with a high degree of independence,
- an ability to initiate and undertake a scientific investigation with a high degree of independence,
- an ability to seek, evaluate, analyse and critically examine information with a high degree of independence,
- a scientific approach.

Course content

The course consists of writing an essay that is publicly defended at a seminar with a discussant and discussing another essay at a seminar. The essay shall be written individually or by two students writing together. The essay shall be in the field of financial economics. In the process of writing, the student is advised by one or more tutors. The main supervisor must hold a PhD. The students shall formulate a clear and original research problem and investigate and analyse the problem in a scholarly manner.

No specific gender perspective is adopted in this course.

Course design

1. Teaching: The supervision of the master thesis is carried out in the form of seminars and individual supervisions. As a part of this process, all students will act as discussants of other students' work.

Assessment

1. Examination: Examination consists of writing the essay, presenting the essay at a midterm and a final seminar, discussing another essay and actively participating in at least three other seminars. Individual performance during the work on the essay can affect the grade. The grade is decided by the supervisor and a co-examiner. The essay must be provided to the database of the Economic Library in order to pass the course.
2. Limitations on the number of examination opportunities: –

The University views plagiarism very seriously, and will take disciplinary action against students for any kind of attempted malpractice in connection with examinations and assessments. Plagiarism is considered to be a very serious academic offence. The penalty that may be imposed for this, and other unfair practices in examinations or assessments, includes suspension from the University for a specified period.
