Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the pro-dean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2007-03-13 to be valid from 2007-03-13, autumn semester 2007.

General Information

The course is offered as a single course. It can normally be included as part of a general degree at the undergraduate or graduate levels. With the approval of the relevant authenticating body, it can also be included in certain professional degrees.

Language of instruction: Danish

Main field of studies

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to describe and analyse Danish grammar from a contrastive perspective
- be able to identify and describe different genres within written communication
- be able to assess various evaluation criteria for the proofreading and revision of texts

Competence and skills

- be able to write comprehensible, coherent, correct Danish
- be able to identify and write within different genres

- be able to examine critically and discuss his/her own texts and those of others in relation to grammar, genre, style and composition
- be a constructive critic of Danish texts, i.e. be able to diagnose weaknesses and strengths in a text and give constructive critical suggestions for improvements which give consideration to the purpose of the text.

Course content

The course deals with Danish grammar and grammatical problems which occur in connection with the texts produced by the student him/herself. Various contemporary genres of text are analysed. The student practices his/her ability to write in Danish and analyse and evaluate his/her own texts and those of others in relation to grammar, genre, style and composition. The characteristics of a good text and how it is written are dealt with in theory and practice. Various genres are presented and texts are discussed from grammatical, stylistic and compositional perspectives. The student is required to write texts from a wide range of genres, for example news articles, essays, letters of application, and stories.

Course design

Teaching consists of exercises, lectures and seminars. All elements involving proficiency are obligatory.

Assessment

The following examination forms can occur: oral and/or written tests at the end of the sub-course, continuous assessment in the form of home assignments, essays and seminars.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

Entry requirements

To be eligible for the course requires the successful completion of NODB02 Basic Danish 2, or the equivalent.

2. This course is offered as a sub-course in NODA11 Danish, Level 1.
3. The points allocated for course content that in whole or in part is commensurate with another course can only be credited once for a degree. For further details see the current registration information and other relevant documentation.
