NODK01, Danish: Level 3 - B.A. course, 30 credits

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the pro-dean for first-cycle studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2011-01-24 and was last revised on 2018-03-19. The revised syllabus applies from 2018-08-31, autumn semester 2018.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. it can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- provide a specialised account of selected parts of the main field of Danish
- account for basic theory of science and research methods focusing on central aspects for the study of literature and linguistics
- account for current research issues in Danish

Competence and skills

- independently seek, collect and critically interpret relevant information
- independently discern, formulate and discuss research problems from different aspects and suggest solutions
- based on a selected issue, identify and apply theories and methods informed by a solid theoretical understanding of linguistics or literature
- independently execute a simple research assignment within the main field of Danish and, within a predetermined time frame, report it in an academic paper that complies with the conventions of academic writing
- use spoken and written Danish with variation and adapted to the situation

Judgement and approach

- assess their own and others'solutions of research issues and adopt a scholarly approach to language and literature
- identify their need of further knowledge to develop their skills in Danish
- discuss and evaluate the status of linguistics and literature in the academic community and the role of research for citizens and society at large with good support

Course content

The course includes an introduction to linguistic and literary theories and methods and an elective module that enables students to achieve specialisation or breadth in their knowledge and skills. The elective module can be Classics of Danish Literature, Danish Children's and Young Adult Literature or another relevant course in the subject of Danish or Swedish/Scandinavian Languages. More information is available from the study advisor. The choice of module must be approved by the examiner.

Furthermore, the course includes a degree project that can specialise in linguistics or literature. The degree project is to be written in Danish.

The course consists of the following modules: ?

- 1. Elective Course: 1a. Classics of Danish Literature, 7.5 credits, 1b. Danish Children's and Young Adult Literature, 7.5 credits, 1c. Other relevant elective course 7.5 credits,
- 2. Theories and Methods of Linguistics and Literary Studies, 7.5 credits,
- 3. Degree Project, 15 credits.

Course design

The teaching consists of exercises, lectures and seminars. It is assumed that the student has access to a computer with internet connection. At the beginning of the course, information about the technical requirements is provided.

The course includes 6-8 compulsory assessed seminars. Attendance at these components is compulsory unless special circumstances apply. Students who have been unable to participate due to circumstances such as accidents or sudden illness will be offered the opportunity to compensate for or re-take compulsory components. This also applies to students who have been absent because of duties as an elected student representative.

Assessment

Elective courses: Classics of Danish Literature is assessed continuously through 3-5 compulsory assignments (to be presented orally) and through a take-home exam at the end of the course. Danish Children's and Young Adult Literature is assessed through a final take-home exam.

Theories and Methods of Linguistics and Literary Studies is assessed through 3-5 assignments to be presented orally and in writing during the course and through a final take-home exam.

The degree project is assessed on the basis of a paper that is discussed at a seminar. The student's defence of their own degree project and critical review of a fellow student's project is included in the assessment.

Passed degree projects at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology can be registered in the LUP Student Papers database if the student so wishes. The student is responsible for uploading the passed degree project as a PDF file in LUP student papers.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

For a grade of Pass on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on all modules. For a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must also have been awarded this grade on the degree project.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have 60 credits in Danish (NODA13 and NODA24, Danish, Level 2, 30 credits) or the equivalent.

Further information

- 1. The course is offered at the the Centre for Languages and Literature, Lund University.
- 2. The elective courses can also be taken as freestanding courses (Classical Danish Literature, NODB13, Danish: Children's and Young Adult Literature NODB17). Module 2 is also included as a module in SSLK01 Swedish- Language and Literature, Level 3.
- 3. The credits allocated for course content that in whole or in part is commensurate with another course can only be credited once for a degree. For further details see the current application information and other relevant documentation.
