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### Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the pro-dean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2007-03-13 to be valid from 2007-03-13, autumn semester 2007.

### General Information

Subject: Nordic Languages

The course is offered as a single course. It can normally be included as part of a general degree at the undergraduate or graduate levels. With the approval of the relevant authenticating body, it can also be included in certain professional degrees.

### Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

#### Knowledge and understanding

- be able to give an account of the structural features of contemporary Icelandic (pronunciation, inflection and word formation, and syntax)
- be able to utilise the key vocabulary of Icelandic associated with a basic modern written language

#### Competence and skills

- be able to read and translate contemporary Icelandic texts of increased difficulty, with the help of dictionaries and other aids
- be able to write in Icelandic, with the help of dictionaries and other aids
- have a comprehensible pronunciation of Icelandic
- be able to analyse forms of inflection and types of clause with the help of an Icelandic grammar.

## Course content

The course provides increased knowledge of contemporary Icelandic. Its emphasis is on text comprehension and language structure. In particular, emphasis is placed on the development of the student's written proficiency in Icelandic.

## Course design

Teaching consists of exercises, lectures, and seminars. All elements involving proficiency are obligatory.

## Assessment

The following examination forms can occur: oral and/or written tests at the end of each sub-course, continuous assessment in the form of home assignments, essays and seminars.

## Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

## Entry requirements

To be eligible for the course requires the successful completion of NOIB01, An Introduction to Icelandic, or the equivalent.
