Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the prodean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2007-06-18 to be valid from 2007-06-18, autumn semester 2007.

General Information

Subject: Polish The course is offered as a single course. It can normally be included as part of a general degree at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. With the approval of the relevant authenticating body, it can also be included in certain professional degrees.

Language of instruction: Swedish

Main field of studies

Depth of study relative to the degree requirements G1F, First cycle, has less than 60 credits in first-cycle course/s as entry requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to identify key paradigms in Polish
- be able to understand and identify the most important differences between Polish and Swedish cultural codes
- have acquired a vocabulary that is sufficient for communication in most everyday situations

Competence and skills

- be able to speak Polish with regard to the elementary rules of Polish pronunciation and participate actively in a simple conversation on a given subject matter,
- be able to ask for and provide various types of information, and describe people as well as ordinary objects and phenomena
- be able to formulate common everyday phrases and be understood in normal communicative situations requiring a direct exchange of ideas in a variety of known subjects or areas
- be able to produce simple texts in Polish that conform to the most basic rules of writing in Polish

Judgement and approach

• be able to compare the structures and diversities of the Polish and Swedish cultures.

Course content

The course is a basic course in Polish, the aim of which is to provide practice in language proficiency and greater knowledge of Polish language, society and daily life.

The course consists of the following three sub-courses:

- 1. Polish Morphology and Reading Comprehension, 7.5 credits
- 2. Written Proficiency, 3 credits
- 3. Oral Proficiency with Polish Life and Institutions, 4.5 credits.

Course design

Teaching takes the form of exercises, lectures and seminars. All elements involving proficiency are obligatory.

Assessment

Examinations can take the following forms: oral and/or written examinations, written assignments, continuous assessment as part of the lectures, seminars and practical exercises.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

To be awarded a Pass on the whole course the student shall have passed all subcourses. To be awarded a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course the student shall have achieved the grade of Pass with Distinction for at least 10 of the 15 higher education credits on the course and the grade of Pass on the remainder of the course.

Entry requirements

To be eligible for the course requires the successful completion of POLB01, or the equivalent.
