RBVB37, Religious Behavioural Studies: Essay, 7.5 credits

Details of approval

The syllabus is an old version, approved by the pro-dean for first-cycle studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2015-12-11 and was valid from 2016-01-18, spring semester 2016.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can be selected as a specialisation course in the Bachelor's programme in Religious Studies and Theology. It can be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- account for previous research within religious behavioural science on the area addressed in the paper
- discuss the difference between primary sources, previous research and handbooks, study resources and other types of material
- explain the characteristics of an academic paper in contrast to other genres/text types, such as journalistic features or opinion pieces

Competence and skills

- produce a minor academic paper based on a predetermined problem area
- select and assess published research of relevance to the paper
- present and discuss the topic in writing in correct Swedish.
- use a system for citations, references and bibliographies that is acceptable in academic contexts

Judgement and approach

- distinguish between scholarly and religious perspectives
- apply good judgement to the assessment of different perspectives in previous research on the topic
- perceptively identify their need of further knowledge on the topic

Course content

The course enables the students to practise taking on an independent assignment that is to be presented in a minor paper. The aim of the course is to provide students with an introduction to and training in academic writing. Based on a predetermined problem area within religious behavioural science, the students write an academic papers individually or in pairs. The students are to presents parts of their work that will be read and commented on by other students on the course. The course is concluded with a compulsory seminar at which the student will critically review the paper of a fellow student and defend their own paper.

Course design

The teaching consists of seminars and lectures.

Assessment

The assessment is based on the writing of a minor paper of approximately 40,000 characters including spaces, a cover sheet, table of contents and list of references, and a final defence seminar.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, the student must have passed Religious Studies and Theology: Level 1 (CTRA12/CTRD12/CTRA11/CTRD01) or History of Religions: Level 1 (RHIA12/RHIA11) or Islamic Studies: Level 1 (ISLA11) or Jewish Studies: Level 1 (JUDA11) or 30 credits in sociology or the equivalent.
