RUMM11, Romanian: Written Proficiency in Romanian, 7.5 credits

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the prodean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2013-05-08 to be valid from 2013-05-08, autumn semester 2013.

General Information

The course is a compulsory component of the Master of Arts programme in Language and Linguistics specialising in Romanian. It is also offered as a freestanding course and can be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Romanian

Depth of study relative to the degree requirements A1N, Second cycle, has only first-cycle course/s as entry requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the students shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to give an account of the key aspects of the vocabulary, grammar, semantics and written structure of the Romanian language, with the help of a modern and appropriate set of concepts
- be able to demonstrate a well-developed ability to compare Romanian to Swedish or other languages

Competence and skills

- be able to express themselves well in correct and varied written Romanian in various situations
- be able to formulate and discuss linguistic issues and problems concerning translation in Romanian
- be able to recognise various types of text and express themselves fluently in Romanian in various types of writing

Judgement and approach

• be able to examine critically and evaluate their own texts written in Romanian and those of others.

Course content

The main aim of the course is to enable students to practise written proficiency within various genres and increase their theoretical understanding of parts of the structure of written language and of various types of text. Particular attention is paid to the comparison of Romanian and Swedish and in some cases other languages. Issues of language preservation and the relationship between language norms and use are also discussed.

Course design

Teaching consists of lectures, seminars and supervised independent studies.

Assessment

The assessment is based on a submitted assignments and a final minor writing project.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have passed 120 credits in Romanian (course RUMK01) or the equivalent.
