RYSA04, Russian: Translation from Russian to Swedish I, 7.5 credits

Ryska: Översättning från ryska till svenska I, 7,5 högskolepoäng First Cycle / Grundnivå

Details of approval

The syllabus is an old version, approved by the pro-dean for first-cycle studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2015-10-06 and was valid from 2015-10-06, autumn semester 2015.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. The course can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Main field of studies

Depth of study relative to the degree requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- account for some basic concepts of translation theory
- account for elements of culture and language contrast that are relevant for translation from Russian into Swedish

Competence and skills

- translate Russian nonfiction texts on general topics into idiomatic and correct Swedish
- adequately use translation tools and perform information searches

Judgement and approach

 critically review different strategies for translating elements of culture and language contrast

Course content

The course provides the student with basic knowledge and skills of translating Russian non-fiction texts into Swedish. Among the topics addressed in the course are the relationship between source text and target text, contrasting culture and language patterns, textual analysis and basic translation aids.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures, seminars, peer review and supervision. The course includes at least seven and no more than ten compulsory written assignments.

Assessment

The assessment is based on 6-10 compulsory written assignments of which at least two determine the grade on the course.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction. The grades awarded are Fail, Pass and Pass with Distinction

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have passed RYSA02 or the equivalent.
