Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2016-12-12 to be valid from 2016-12-12, spring semester 2017.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Language of instruction: Swedish and Russian

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- describe central parts of Russian grammar
- describe the grammatical structure of Russian from contrastive point of view

Competence and skills

- analyse the grammar of Russian from a basic contrastive perspective
- identify and analyse parts of speech and clause elements in Russian sentences
- analyse and form main and subordinate clauses on Russian
- apply central parts of Russian grammar in speech and writing focusing on irregular inflections
- translate simple texts containing common words from Swedish into Russian

Judgement and approach

• critically review, discuss and take a position on language norms, and adopt a scholarly approach to language.

Course content

The course contains components leading to knowledge about the grammatical structure of Russian. Furthermore, students train practical language proficiency focusing on written production.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures and exercises. Compulsory components (2-3) are included in the course.

Assessment

The assessment is based on compulsory written exercises (10) and a written exam at the end of the course.

The examiner may deviate from the regular form of examination if the student has been granted an alternative form of examination by the Disability Support Services, and if it complies with the learning outcomes of the course.

The examiner may deviate from the regular form of examination if it cannot be implemented during a re-examination, and if it complies with the learning outcomes of the course.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

For a grade Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade on the exam and on at least 7 of the written assignments and the grade Pass on the remaining components.

Entry requirements

General requirements and studies equivalent of courses English 6 and Russian 3 from Swedish Upper Secondary School.

- 1. The course is offered at the the Centre for Languages and Literature, Lund University.
- 2. The course is a module of the course Russian: Level 1 (RYSA10)
- 3. The credits allocated for course content that in whole or in part is commensurate with another course can only be credited once for a degree.
- 4. Exemption from the admission requirement of Russian 3 from upper secondary school can be made for students who have passed Russian: Beginners' Course (30 credits) or the equivalent.
