RYSB01, Russian: Elementary Course I, 15 credits Ryska: Nybörjarkurs I, 15 högskolepoäng First Cycle / Grundnivå

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the prodean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2008-06-19 and was last revised on 2022-03-10 by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology. The revised syllabus applies from 2022-03-10, autumn semester 2022.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Language of instruction: Russian and English

Main field of studies

Russian

Depth of study relative to the degree requirements G1N, First cycle, has only upper-secondary level entry requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- identify certain common declension patterns and grammatical constructions in Russian
- understand and account for the contents of a simplified Russian text at a level that corresponds to CEFR A1

Competence and skills

• describe the contents of Russian that is spoken slowly and clearly and deals with familiar and set subjects

- translate into Russian and correctly spell words that occur in set texts
- read Russian texts aloud with correct pronunciation that allows for good comprehension
- to some extent speak Russian in everyday situations and demonstrate skills that correspond to the requirements of CEFR level A1

Judgement and approach

• critically review, discuss and take a position on language norms

Course content

The course is based on a study of simplified dialogues and texts in Russian with elementary vocabulary and basic grammatical structures. The course also includes simple written exercises and role play of everyday situations. Furthermore, students practise Russian pronunciation and oral proficiency in connection with exercises in listening comprehension, pronunciation and conversation.

The course consists of the following modules:

- 1. Russian Grammar and Text Study I, 7.5 credits,
- 2. Oral and Written Proficiency I, 7.5 credits.

Course design

The teaching consists of exercises, lessons and lectures.

Assessment

Module 1 is assessed on the basis of a written exam.

Module 2 is assessed on the basis of a written assignment and an oral exam.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.
