General Information

Subject: Humanistic Informatics

The course is offered as a free-standing course. It can normally be included as part of a first- or second-cycle degree. With the approval of the relevant authenticating body, it can also be included in certain professional degrees.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course students shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to account for fundamental concepts and methods for the study of network culture in present-day Latin America
- be able to provide examples of Latin American studies of the activities of women in the public space
- be able to account for fundamental concepts such as power, intersectionality, gender, sexuality, class and ethnicity in relation to the use of the Internet in

Competence and skills

- be able to formulate and delimit issues of gender theory in a written examination assignment
- be able to execute on a fundamental level some of the key practical tasks for developing and designing computer games

Judgement and approach

• be able to assess the impact of media digitalisation for the self-governance of women in Latin America.

Course content

The course deals with women's use of digital media in twenty-first-century Latin America. Special attention is paid to the Latin American production of computer games. Key events are studied in relation to prominent female agents and against a historical background in order to explain the conditions for the present-day development.

Course design

Teaching consists of lectures and compulsory practical exercises in a computer room.

Assessment

Assessment is based on a written exam.
