General Information

Subject: Ethnology

The course is offered as a free-standing course. It can normally be included as part of a first- or second-cycle degree.

Language of instruction: English

Main field of studies

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Depth of study relative to the degree requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the students shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to account at a basic level for some cultural-analytical perspectives on Swedish society and everyday life,
- be able to provide a general and basic account of everyday life in Sweden from a historical perspective, focusing on the modern era,
- be able to account for the way in which gender, class, age and ethnicity affect culture and everyday life,

Competence and skills

- be able to discover, describe and problematise some everyday phenomena in their own culture,
- be able to conduct a cultural analysis using concepts from the cultural sciences,
- be able to present their own and others' research findings both orally and in writing,

Judgement and approach

- be able to take a critical approach to scholarly works in subject areas of relevance to the course.

Course content

The course provides an introduction to Swedish culture and everyday life. The course includes a minor field study consisting of exercises in observing the surrounding society and analysis of the material collected.

Course design

Teaching consists of group exercises, lectures and seminars. Active participation in the group exercises and seminars is compulsory.

Assessment

The assessment is based on a written exam at the end of the course.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, E, D, C, B, A.

The highest grade is A and the lowest passing grade is E. The grade for a non-passing result is Fail.
