General Information

Subject: Art History and Visual Studies

The course is offered as a free-standing course. It can normally be included as part of a general first- or second-cycle degree.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to give a basic account of the main patterns in Swedish and Scandinavian art history
- be able to give a general description of key currents in Western art history

Competence and skills

- be able to give basic descriptions of artwork, buildings and architectural environments and their stylistic properties
- be able to identify and discuss objects from art history in relationship to style and fashion history

• be able to relate currents in Scandinavian art history to events in international art history

Judgement and approach

• be able to in general terms, relate events in art history to the social context in terms of, for example, power, gender and ethnicity perspectives.

Course content

The course deals with Swedish art from the pre-historical period to the 21st century in the context of the art of other Scandinavian countries and international comparisons.

The objects of study comprise diverse types of work: artwork, mass-produced images and photographs, architecture and urban planning, etc.

Course design

Teaching consists of lectures, seminars, group work and 2-3 compulsory study visits to examine original works.

Assessment

The assessment is based on 2-3 individual written assignments.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, E, D, C, B, A.

The highest grade is A and the lowest passing grade is E. The grade for a non-passing result is Fail.
