Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the pro-dean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2013-10-11 to be valid from 2013-10-11, spring semester 2014.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can be included as an elective course in the Master's programme in Religious Studies and Theology. The course can be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to independently and in detail summarise and clarify tendencies and perspectives in the current discussion in missiology
- be able to summarise, explain and critically comment on current research and key theories within a few areas in missiology

Competence and skills

- be able to highly independently analyse, review and deal with material and issues concerning missiology
- be able to apply and review advanced theories in missiology in detail
- be able to formulate independent views on advanced issues in missiology
- be able to write independent texts correctly describing and critically discussing missiological issues for both national and international audiences
- be able to constructively participate in discussions of advanced issues in theology

Judgement and approach

- be able to critically and self-critically review theological arguments and positions and assess their relevance for society at large and the responsibility of the individual for how research is used
- be able to take an informed and responsible position on the tension between scholarly and confessional discourse and their respective claims to truth
- be able to take responsibility for his or her development of knowledge through self-critical assessments and active acquisition of knowledge.

Course content

On the basis of prior knowledge, the student selects two areas of missiology and world Christianity or detailed study in consultation with the lecturer on the course. The student is to read 1200-1500 pages in each area, selected independently and submitted in a proposed reading list to the lecturer for comments. When the student and lecturer have agreed on titles, the lecturer approves the list.

The following areas are available for selection:

1. Theology of mission
2. Missionary history
3. Missionary practice
4. Theology of religion, dialogue and relationships between religions
5. Context in theology and contextual theology
6. Global Christianity
7. Ecumenism

Course design

The course consists of independent study and some supervision.

Assessment

The assessment is based on oral and written reports, at least one of which is to address an international academic audience in the form of, for example, a review for a research journal, a conference paper or a research article.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

In order to be awarded a grade of Pass on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade in both the studied areas. In order to be awarded a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must have been awarded this grade in both the studied areas.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have a Bachelor's degree and have passed the course Missiology and World Christianity, Second Cycle Course I, 15 credits (TEOM34).
