Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to account for common theoretical perspectives in classics studies
- be able to account for the problems and opportunities of applying modern theories to classical source material

Competence and skills

- be able to apply fundamental methodological and theoretical terminology
- be able to apply different theoretical perspectives on classical source material

Judgement and approach

- be able to critically discuss a specific theoretical perspective from the point of view of the results achieved
- be able to critically discuss the relationship between historical reality and historical reconstruction
- be able to critically assess the impact of ideological preconceptions on historical reconstructions

Course content

The course is primarily taught in conjunction with a study trip to Rome. It consists of lectures dealing with theoretical perspectives such as postcolonialism, ideology studies, social sciences and hermeneutics, and seminar exercises based on classical texts and historical artefacts or on research articles adopting different perspectives, in which students practise applying different theoretical perspectives and taking a critical position on research results in the form of historical reconstructions or translations of classical texts.

Course design

The course is taught intensively over 10 days in Rome together with the course Religion and Society in the MA programme Religious Roots of Europe. Some of the teaching takes place on the online platform of the programme.

Assessment

The assessment is based on a written assignment of 5-6 pages.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have a Bachelor's degree in theology, religious studies, classical philology, classical archaeology, history or the equivalent and 20 credits in Latin, Greek, Arabic or Hebrew.
