ABMM53, Library and Information Studies: The Digital Library, 7.5 credits

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2011-11-08 and was last revised on 2021-02-22. The revised syllabus applies from 2021-02-22, autumn semester 2021.

General Information

The course is a compulsory component of the Information Studies specialisation of the Master of Arts programmes in Archival Studies, Library and Information Studies, and Museum Studies.

Language of instruction: Swedish

The language of instruction is primarily Swedish, but teaching in other Scandinavian languages or English may occur.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- account for different perspectives of libraries in the digital society
- in a specialised manner, interrogate issues concerning the organisation of knowledge linked to online environments and digital resources of relevance to libraries

Competence and skills

- apply different perspectives on digital publication and analyse digital strategies
- be able to reflect and problematize various factors affecting services and activities in digital libraries and be aware of some methods for evaluation,
- take aspects of source criticism and target groups into account when selecting online resources to be included in a library's services

Judgement and approach

• discuss ethical aspects of the library's role and the function of information in the digital society

Course content

The course interrogates different perceptions in research and institutional discourse of the library in digital society. Different types of libraries are studied from different vantage points such as discussions of key components in the design of digital library services, and different problems and phenomena in digital society that concern the library as an institution. The course includes a discussion of relevant sociotechnical aspects of libraries and information in digital society.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures, supervised group exercises, seminars and study visits. The supervised group exercises, two seminars and two study visits are compulsory. Students are required to make up for any absence with a written assignment.

Assessment

The assessment is based on two seminars (1,5 credits), one group assignment (1,5 credits) and an individual paper (4,5 credits).

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Marking scale: Fail, Pass.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have passed ABMM52 or the equivalent.
