Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2009-04-28 to be valid from 2009-04-28, autumn semester 2009.

General Information

The course is offered as a free-standing course and can normally be included as part of a general first- or second-cycle degree. With the approval of the relevant authenticating body, it can also be included in certain professional degrees.

Language of instruction: English

The course is normally taught in English. It can be taught in Swedish if an agreement is reached by both the teacher and the students. Such an agreement would depend on both the lecturer and the students having a good knowledge of Swedish.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to account for the current research on the origins of language
- be able to account for different types of communication between animals and describe similarities and differences between animal and human language

- be able to describe certain physiological and neural conditions for language from the perspective of evolution
- be able to describe similarities and differences between biological and cultural evolution and the possibilities for interaction between them
- be able to explain aspects of the complex relationship between mind and language at an advanced level.

Competence and skills

• be able to compare different hypotheses on the origins of language on the basis of empirical evidence.

Judgement and approach

• be able to critically assess different hypotheses on the origins of language.

Course content

The course deals with current interdisciplinary research on the origins of language. Focus is placed on the relationship between biological and cultural evolution and physiological and neural conditions for language from the perspective of evolution. Furthermore, the course addresses animal communication, experiments on language acquisition in primates and other animals, the relationship between mind and language and different hypotheses on the origins of language and evaluation of these on the basis of empirical evidence.

Course design

Teaching consists of lectures and seminars.

Assessment

The assessment is based on an oral report on selections of the required reading and a written assignment which addresses a theme of the course at an advanced level.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course students must have passed the course LINB02 or 60 credits in a language subject or the equivalent.
