ARAB04, Arabic: Elementary Course I - Online Course, 15 credits

Arabiska: Nybörjarkurs I - nätbaserad kurs, 15 högskolepoäng First Cycle / Grundnivå

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the prodean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2013-03-07 to be valid from 2013-03-07, autumn semester 2013.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course and can be included as part of a firstor second-cycle degree.

Language of instruction: Arabic and Swedish

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to give an account of the basic grammar, morphology and phonetics of modern standard Arabic,
- be able to account for basic knowledge of modern standard Arabic in speech and writing,

Competence and skills

- be able to express themselves in modern standard Arabic at an elementary level,
- be able to make themselves understood in spoken and written Arabic in everyday situations demanding a vocabulary of 800 Words,

- be able to read and comprehend simple adapted texts in Arabic,
- be able to use an online Arabic dictionary,

Judgement and approach

- demonstrate awareness of the cultural and social contexts in which Arabic is used today,
- be able to reflect critically on culture-specific concepts and values expressed through the Arabic language.

Course content

The course deals with the basic writing and sound system of Arabic and provides the student with a systematic overview of the declensions and syntax. Equal weight is given to written and oral skills and listening and reading comprehension as to translation to and from Arabic. The course actively trains the student's ability to use Arabic practically through conversation and writing exercises focusing on the ability to communicate in simple and useful everyday situations.

Furthermore, students are trained in the ability to use an online Arabic dictionary.

The course consists of the following modules:

- 1. Modern Standard Arabic, Introduction I, 7.5 credits,
- 2. Communicative Arabic I, 7.5 credits.

Course design

The course is offered as a distance learning course and makes use of an online learning platform and/or digital tools. It presupposes that students who enrol on the course understand these conditions and have access to a computer with internet connections. Further information regarding technical requirements is available from the department. Attendance is compulsory at e-meeting exercises.

Assessment

The assessment is based on an oral and written exam at the end of the course, and on approximately 20 assignments throughout the course.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

To be awarded a Pass on the whole course the student must have passed all modules. To be awarded the grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course the student must been awarded a grade of Pass with Distinction on both modules.

General requirements and studies equivalent of course English 6 from Swedish Upper Secondary School.
