Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by the programmes director by delegation from the pro-dean for first- and second-cycle studies on 2013-12-16 to be valid from 2013-12-16, spring semester 2014.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course and can be included as part of a first or second cycle degree.

Teaching language: Swedish or English.

Main field of studies

Middle Eastern Studies

Depth of study relative to the degree requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the students shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to give an account of the modern history of Turkey
- be able to give an account of different political processes and the social development in a historical context

Competence and skills

- be able to analyse events and circumstances, such as those of politics and society, in the modern history of Turkey

- be able to analyse materials of relevance to the study of the development and modernisation of Turkey, e.g. historical documents
- be able to analyse Turkish policies with regard to internal, transnational, regional and international issues and problems
- be able to formulate and analyse research issues emerging from the study of modern Turkey
- be able to demonstrate good proficiency in oral and written communication

Judgement and approach

- be able to discuss and take a scholarly position on the modernisation of Turkey and problems associated with this in speech and writing.

Course content

The course deals with the emergence of modern Turkey and the comprehensive modernisation projects that started in conjunction with the establishment of the nation state. Among further objects of study are the development of Turkey at different political levels including nation building, democracy issues, the role of the army in politics, the Kurds, the Cyprus conflict, and Turkey's role in the region and ambitions to become a member of the EU.

Course design

Teaching consists of lectures and at least two seminar and group exercises. Participation in the seminar and group exercises is compulsory.

Assessment

The assessment is based on a written exam at the end of the course and active participation in the compulsory seminar and group exercises. Active participation accounts for 30 per cent of the final grade on the course.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course students must have passed course ARAH16 Regional Security in the Middle East and ARAH18 Term Paper, or the equivalent.
