Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2009-10-15 to be valid from 2009-10-15, spring semester 2010.

General Information

The course is a compulsory component of the Master of Arts programme in Language and Linguistics specialising in Arabic. The course is also offered as a free-standing course and can normally be included as part of a first- or second-cycle degree. With the approval of the relevant authenticating body, it can also be included in certain professional degrees.

Language of instruction: Swedish and Arabic

The course is normally taught in Swedish and Arabic. It can be taught in English and Arabic if an agreement is reached by both the teacher and the students.

Main field of studies

Language and Linguistics with specialization in Arabic

Depth of study relative to the degree requirements

A1N, Second cycle, has only first-cycle course/s as entry requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- demonstrate familiarity with the breadth and variation of Arabic literature
- aided by supervision, be able to read, analyse and interpret a relevant selection of Arabic non-fiction
- demonstrate knowledge of the stylistic characteristics of non-fiction

Competence and skills

- be able to discuss issues in a chosen area of enquiry with a high degree of autonomy
- be able to assess critically, compile and evaluate data from different historical sources

Judgement and approach

- be able to take a position with regard to a general humanist tradition and relate it to the history of classic Arabic literature and to a chosen area of enquiry.

Course content

The course consists of reading and analysis of non-fiction texts from different areas and independent study of non-fiction texts of relevance to the students degree projects.

Course design

Teaching consists of lectures, seminars, group exercises and supervised independent study.

Assessment

Examination takes the form of a written exam in conjunction with the course.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course students must have a Bachelor s degree in Arabic or equivalent knowledge of Arabic.
