BBHB52, Book History: History of the Library, 7.5 credits Bokhistoria: Bibliotekens historia, 7,5 högskolepoäng First Cycle / Grundnivå

Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2020-03-10 to be valid from 2020-03-10, autumn semester 2020.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- provide a general account of the history of libraries and book collecting in the West from Antiquity to the present day
- provide a general account of the different principles for the organisation of libraries and book collections throughout the history
- account for how libraries have functioned as a power resource and as an institution of learning
- account for how changes to social conditions have been reflected in the roles, function and use of the libraries

Competence and skills

- highlight the history of libraries and book collections, primarily in the West, through examples and based on existing research
- critically analyse and discuss the historical changes to libraries and information management
- critically analyse and compare the function and use of libraries from a historical perspective

Judgement and approach

- relate the symbolic value of libraries to a social context
- assess the conditions for book collecting with regard to gender and social construction throughout history
- evaluate the social preconditions for access to libraries as a source of information and knowledge, from a historical perspective.

Course content

The course provides students with basic knowledge of the preconditions, purpose and function of libraries and book collecting from Antiquity to the present day. The course covers the significance of private and public book collections as a power resource and public utility. The conditions for collecting, describing, preserving and providing books are studied. The symbolic value of libraries throughout the history is discussed.

Course design

The course is offered entirely as a distance learning course, supported by an online learning platform and/or digital tools. Optional meetings on campus may occur. Students are required to participate according to these conditions, and to have access to a computer with an internet connection. Participation in group discussions is compulsory. The department will provide information about the technical requirements.

Assessment

The assessment of the course is based on active participation in group discussions and on two written individual assignments.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

Assessment of the course is based on one shorter and one longer written assignment. For the grade of Pass with Distinction on the course, the student must have been awarded the grade of Pass with Distinction on the longer assignment.
