Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- provide a general account of how sexuality is perceived and used in texts from Antiquity, from the Hebrew Bible to early Christianity
- identify similarities and differences in the ways sexuality is portrayed in different texts and times, with biblical texts as a starting point
- provide a basic account of how sexual language influences the theology of different texts

Competence and skills

- discuss and problematise sexuality as a historical process
- discuss and problematise the role of sexuality in biblical and antique texts as a part of this historical process

Judgement and approach

- demonstrate awareness of historical and contemporary perspectives on gender and minority groups
- demonstrate a basic ability to approach theologies of biblical texts from a queer perspective

Course content

The course covers the role of sexuality in three different contexts: in Ancient Greece, the Hebrew Bible and in early Christianity. The course problematises the image of sexuality as something homogenous with a focus on chosen texts from the time between ca. 500 BCE to 500 CE. The course provides students with knowledge of different contexts and texts in which the role of sexuality is important and has played a significant role for subsequent religious traditions. The course also provides students with the tools to approach different sexualities in the Bible and the sexual theologies that emerge from it.

Course design

The course is offered as a distance learning course and makes use of an online learning platform and digital tools. Students are required to participate under these conditions, and to have access to a computer with an Internet connection. Teaching consists of recorded lectures, written reading instructions and seminar exercises. Participation at all seminars is compulsory. Absence from seminars and activities may be compensated for in the form of a written assignment.

Assessment

Assessment of the course is based on one final written assignment and three written seminar exercises.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

For the grade of Pass, in addition to participation in all course components and compulsory seminars, students must have been awarded a Pass on the seminar texts and on the final assignment. For the grade of Pass with Distinction, students must

also have been awarded the grade of Pass with Distinction on the final assignment.
