Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2022-11-23. The syllabus comes into effect 2023-08-28 and is valid from the autumn semester 2023.

General information

The course is a compulsory component of the Bachelor of Arts programme in Digital Cultures.

Language of instruction: Swedish Components of the course may be taught in other Scandinavian languages or in English.

Main field of study Specialisation

Cultural Sciences with specialization in G1N, First cycle, has only upper-secondary Digital Cultures level entry requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Competence and skills

- identify a problem area in the current theme of the module with relevance for the knowledge field of digital cultures
- formulate an issues of relevance to the problem area in consultation with the actors concerned
- suggest a solution adapted to the chosen issue
- present the chosen solution in a relevant form

Judgement and approach

• explain their choice of issue, problem and form of presentation

Course content

The course is included in the first semester of the BA programme.

The aim is to provide students with knowledge and skills to independently, individually or in groups, develop and conduct a project specialising in a specific subject within digital cultures of value to the stakeholders of the project. Major emphasis is placed on the development of ideas and presentation as well as on the description of the chosen issue and the argumentation for it.

Course design

The teaching consists of seminars, group exercises and scheduled supervision.

Assessment

The assessment is based on ongoing assignments and a project presentation.

Three opportunities for examination are offered in conjunction with the course: a first examination, a re-sit close to the first examination and a second re-sit in the same year. At least two further re-examinations on the same course content are offered within a year of the end of the course. After this, further re-examination opportunities are offered only if re-taking the course, and then in accordance with the then current course syllabus.

If it is not possible to use the same form of assessment at the re-sit, the examiner may deviate from it, as long as it is commensurate with the learning outcomes.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.
