# ENEK06, English: Level 3 - B. A. Course (Degree Project), 15 credits

Engelska: Kandidatkurs (examensarbete), 15 högskolepoäng First Cycle / Grundnivå

## Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2016-01-29 to be valid from 2016-01-29, spring semester 2016.

### General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

# Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, students shall be able to

#### Knowledge and understanding

- provide a specialised account of an elective field of English language or literature
- account for relevant and current research questions
- account for methodological choices in a selected research field

## Competence and skills

- execute a literary analysis correctly using established critical concepts or (depending on specialisation) execute a study of linguistic data using linguistic concepts and methods
- independently identify, formulate and solve problems within linguistics or literary studies
- use their time in such a way as to be able to complete assignments within predetermined time frames
- independently seek and use information within English linguistics or literary studies in libraries and databases
- discuss and present their own research and that of others while taking the context and audience into account
- use correct and idiomatic English when writing texts of an academic nature
- apply correct referencing and citation techniques in accordance with the standards in linguistics or literary studies

## Judgement and approach

- critically review and assess different types of sources
- discuss the role of English in society and the responsibility of individuals and organisations for how it is used
- identify their need of further knowledge and skills
- make assessments informed by relevant disciplinary, societal or ethical aspects

#### Course content

The students choose (or have already chosen) a specialisation in either linguistics or literature for their studies. The skills and knowledge they have acquired on previous courses are to be applied in a degree project also enabling them to reinforce their ability to use English in speech and writing.

# Course design

The teaching consists of seminars and individual supervision of the degree project. The supervision is limited to the semester the student first registered on the course, unless there are special reasons for another decision. The defence seminar is compulsory.

#### Assessment

The assessment is based on

an individual degree project presented in the form of an academic paper. The degree project is to be discussed and defended at a final seminar. The discussion and defence are mandatory components of the assessment.

Passed degree projects at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology can be registered in the LUP Student Papers database if the student so wishes. The student is

responsible for uploading the passed degree project as a PDF file in LUP student papers.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

#### Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

For a grade of Pass on the whole course, the student must have been awarded at least this grade on the degree project. For a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must have been awarded at least this grade on the degree project.

## Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have a degree of Bachelor from a university abroad and (or consisting of) the equivalent of 75 credits in English (or the equivalent), of which at least 30 credits (or the equivalent) of general courses in English (for example grammar, pronunciation, written language proficiency, oral language proficiency, literature) or the equivalent and at least 10 credits (or the equivalent) of theoretical courses in English linguistics (or the equivalent) or English literature (or the equivalent). The course does not require knowledge of Swedish.

## Further information

- 1. The course is taught together with English: Level 3, 61-90 credits.
- 2. The credits allocated for course content that in whole or in part is commensurate with another course can only be credited once for a degree. For further details see the current registration information and other relevant documentation.
- 3. The course is offered at the Centre for Languages and Literature, Lund University.
