Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2019-06-11 and was last revised on 2025-02-20 by The Pro Dean of First and Second Cycle Studies at The Joint Faculties of Humanities and Theology (U 2024/845). The revised syllabus comes into effect 2025-03-10 and is valid from the autumn semester 2025.

The course is included in the Bachelor's programme in English. The course can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- account for the basic features of English phonetics and patterns of intonation
- account for basic structures in general grammar and English grammar
- identify important differences between English and Swedish grammar

Competence and skills

use phonetic script

- analyse English clauses, phrases and words at a basic level,
- understand and use a significant vocabulary of general English words and phrases
- use grammatically correct Standard English in writing

Judgement and approach

• assess the suitability of different English expressions and sentences from a Standard English perspective.

Course content

The course deals with English language structure with regard to grammar, phonology and vocabulary. The students will practise analysing the English language and account for grammatical and pronunciation-related phenomena. Based on lectures and seminars in the early stages of the course, students practise basic applied analysis of the the form, meaning and use of English words and phrases. The course deals with important factors for efficient second language learning of words and phrases, and students are expected to work systematically and continuously with their own learning process during the course, mainly through self-study based on mandatory texts. Another focus of the course is on factors associated with English pronunciation, which helps students reach a level where they can communicate well in English with both native and other speakers of English.

The course is divided into the following three modules

- 1. Grammar, 7.5 credits
- 2. Phonetics and Pronunciation, 4.5 credits
- 3. Vocabulary, 3 credits

Course design

The teaching consists of group exercises, lectures, seminars, workshops and teaching via a virtual learning environment. Pronunciation practice in a language lab may be included.

Assessment

- 1. The assessment of Grammar (7.5 credits) is based on a written invigilated exam.
- 2. The assessment of Phonetics and Pronunciation (4.5 credits) is based on a written invigilated exam.
- 3. The assessment of Vocabulary (3 credits) is based on 3-4 minor written tests during the course and a final written invigilated exam. The students' results in the minor tests are added to that of the final exam and the total score determines the grade for the Vocabulary component.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction For a grade of Pass on the whole course, the students must have been awarded at least this grade for all three modules. For a grade of Pass with Distinction on the whole course, the student must also have been awarded this grade for at least 10 credits.
