Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2019-06-11 to be valid from 2019-06-11, spring semester 2020.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It is also included in the Bachelor's programme in English. The course can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Main field of studies

English

Depth of study relative to the degree requirements G1F, First cycle, has less than 60 credits in first-cycle course/s as entry requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- account for English literary history
- account for the characteristics of different eras and the most significant authors and works in English literary history
- make adequate use of relevant concepts and terms in English literary studies

Competence and skills

• analyse the subject matter of English fiction and non-fiction and argue for different perspectives

Judgement and approach

- compare, assess and argue for different analyses of a single text
- discuss explicit and implicit statements about class, gender and ethnicity in texts

Course content

The course consists of a study of selected English texts from the earliest period to the late 20th century with a focus on the major authors. The texts are studied in the context of cultural history.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures and seminars.

Assessment

The assessment is based on a written invigilated exam.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.
