Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2022-04-22 to be valid from 2022-04-22, spring semester 2022.

General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course. It can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the student shall

Knowledge and understanding

- be able to account for basic structures in English grammar,
- be able to account for basic features of English speech sounds and patterns of intonation,

Competence and skills

- be able to use general English words and phrases appropriately in a sentence and understand their meaning in a specific context,
- be able to comprehend conversations and written texts in English on general topics,

- be able to produce short texts in English on topics related to social- and work/study situations,
- be able to adapt their use of the English language to different audiences,

Judgement and approach

be able to identify their need for further knowledge to improve their skills in English and take responsibility for their own continued learning, be able to critically review and evaluate different types of resources for English language learning.

Course content

With an emphasis on interaction and engagement, the course builds on students' prior knowledge of English to further develop their spoken and written communication skills. The course provides the students with ample opportunities to develop and practice their communicative competence for social and work/study-related environments. The seminars cover a range of aspects related to vocabulary, grammar, spoken fluency, reading, writing, and comprehension. In particular, the course focuses on developing the students' language learning strategies through informed use of different types of language resources.

Course design

Teaching consists of 9 interactive online seminars. Attending a minimum of 6 seminars is obligatory.

Assessment

The assessment is based on 2 spoken and 2 written assignments.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.
