Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The Pro Dean of First and Second Cycle Studies at The Joint Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2025-12-01 (U 2025/949). The syllabus comes into effect 2026-01-01 and is valid from the autumn semester 2025.

General information

The course is offered in the Bachelor's programme in English Studies, semester 3. It can normally be included in a first or second-cycle degree.

Language of instruction: English

Main field of study *Specialisation*

English G2F, First cycle, has at least 60 credits in first-cycle course/s as entry requirements

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the student is to be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

- provide a specialised account of an elective field within English language or English literature.

Competence and skills

- discuss relevant course material in speech and in writing in correct and idiomatic academic English.

Judgement and approach

- identify their own need for further knowledge and expertise.

Course content

Students are able to specialise in a chosen area of English language or literature. At the beginning of the semester, a number of elective courses (normally 4-6) are presented in both speech and writing. The students on the course and on other courses with equivalent elective components choose from these courses as well as ranking them. Students are then allocated to the elective courses based on the students' choices and rankings. When necessary, for example if one of the elective courses is overly popular, the students' academic qualifications in English (the number of credits and the number of grades of Pass with Distinction) will determine which students are awarded their first choice. In exceptional cases, one of the offered elective courses may be cancelled, for example, if the applicants per place is too low.

Course design

Teaching consists of seminars.

Assessment

The assessment is based on different forms depending on the nature of the individual course, e.g. written exam, written assignments such as take-home exams, essays, "response papers" and "learning journals", oral presentations and compulsory assessed seminars. The assessment can also be based on the performance of a play.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Grading scale includes the grades: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction

Entry requirements

General entry requirements and 60 credits in the Bachelor's programme in English Studies in Lund, or equivalent knowledge.
