Course content

The course deals with English language structure with regard to grammar, phonology and vocabulary. The students will practise analysing the English language and account for grammatical and pronunciation phenomena. Based on lectures and seminars in the early stages of the course, students practise basic applied analysis of the the form, meaning and use of English words and phrases.

Course design

The teaching consists of lectures, workshops and teaching via a virtual learning environment.

Assessment

The assessment is based on a written invigilated exam.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.
