General Information

The course is offered as a freestanding course for exchange students.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- account for English literary history
- account for the characteristics of different eras and the most significant authors and works in English literary history

Competence and skills

- analyse the content of fiction and non-fiction texts in English and argue for alternative interpretations
- discuss advanced fiction and non-fiction texts in English using appropriate vocabulary

Judgement and approach

- compare, assess and argue for different analyses of a single text
- discuss explicit and implicit statements about class, gender and ethnicity in texts

Course content

In this course the students study a selection of English texts from the earliest times to the late 20th century with an emphasis on the most famous authors. These are studied in the context of cultural history.

Course design

The teaching consists of group lectures and seminars.

Assessment

The assessment of this course is based on a written invigilated exam.

The examiner may deviate from the regular form of assessment if it cannot be implemented during a re-examination, and if it complies with the learning outcomes of the course.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

The course grade will be based on the final invigilated exam.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, the student must have completed ENGA04 (English: Level 1) or acquired the equivalent knowledge.
