**ENGE25, English: Literary Analysis, 7.5 credits**

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### Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2019-01-30 to be valid from 2019-01-30, spring semester 2019.

### General Information

This is a freestanding course intended for exchange students.

### Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

### Competence and skills

- express themselves in writing in correct English
- search for and make use of information in English available in libraries and databases
- based on critical source management, produce an investigative paper in English that applies correct reference and citation techniques
- use a very extensive general English word and phrase vocabulary, and a basic academic word and phrase vocabulary, partly receptively and partly productively, in written assignments
- comply with established time frames and deadlines
- analyse the content of fiction and non-fiction texts in English and argue for alternative interpretations

- discuss advanced fiction and non-fiction texts in English using appropriate vocabulary

### **Judgement and approach**

- compare, assess and argue for different analyses of a single text
- discuss explicit and implicit statements about class, gender and ethnicity in texts

### **Course content**

The students will practise information retrieval in libraries and databases as well as write literary papers with references. Students are also to pursue the practice of planning their time and keeping up with predetermined time frames.

### **Course design**

The teaching consists of group exercises, lectures and seminars.

### **Assessment**

The assessment of this course is based on an independent academic paper.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

### **Grades**

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

### **Entry requirements**

To be admitted to the course, the student must have completed ENGA04 (English: Level 1) or acquired the equivalent knowledge.
