Details of approval

The syllabus was approved by The pro-dean for First-Cycle Studies at the Faculties of Humanities and Theology on 2021-09-14 to be valid from 2021-09-14, spring semester 2022.

General Information

The course is part of the Bachelor of Arts programme in English Studies, semester 6. It can normally be included in a first or second cycle degree.

Prior to semester 6, students in the Bachelor of Arts programme in English Studies choose a specialisation in either linguistics or literature. The students who choose the specialisation in linguistics take this course in English linguistics.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the students shall be able to

Knowledge and understanding

- provide an advanced account of selected parts of English linguistics
- provide a basic account of theory of knowledge and research methodology in English linguistics and contrast different research methods
- account for current research issues in English linguistics and, at a basic level, relate these questions to the subject in general

Competence and skills

- use language that is adapted to the situation with words and phrases of relevance to the genre and communication situation
- independently search for and use information on English linguistics in libraries and databases
- carry out a study of linguistic data using linguistic concepts and methods
- apply correct reference and citation techniques as they are used in linguistic texts

Judgement and approach

- critically review and evaluate different types of sources
- address class, gender and ethnicity in texts and language
- identify their need for further knowledge to improve their skills in English

Course content

The course covers method and theory in English linguistics in such a way as to support students in their choice of subject, theory or method for the degree project and to help them to write even better degree projects. By studying academic texts and writing academic texts themselves, students develop their academic writing skills.

Course design

Teaching consists of seminars.

Assessment

Assessment of the course is based on a final individual written assignment (paper) and 1-2 minor written or oral assignments, individually or in groups. The final written assignment is worth the most.

The examiner, in consultation with Disability Support Services, may deviate from the regular form of examination in order to provide a permanently disabled student with a form of examination equivalent to that of a student without a disability.

Subcourses that are part of this course can be found in an appendix at the end of this document.

Grades

Marking scale: Fail, Pass, Pass with distinction.

For the grade of Pass on the course, students must have been awarded at least the grade of Pass on all assessed components. For the grade of Pass with Distinction on the course, students must also have been awarded the grade of Pass with Distinction on the final written assignment.

Entry requirements

To be admitted to the course, students must have successfully completed 125 credits in the Bachelor of Arts programme in English Studies at Lund University (or the equivalent), of which at least 75 credits must be in English.

1. The course is offered at the Centre for Languages and Literature, Lund University.
2. This course is identical to and studied with the equivalent module in ENKG03 and ENGH15.
3. The credits allocated for course content that in whole or in part is commensurate with another course can only be credited once for a degree.
